Ride for Very Special Kids

MEMBERS OF H.O.G. Dandenong Chapter turned out in strength to support the Very Special Kids (VSK) foundation on Sunday 12 February.

The foundation cares for children with life-threatening conditions by providing a children's hospice and professional family support services.

VSK help more than 900 families across Victoria with ongoing support, from their child's initial diagnosis, through to recovery or bereavement.

This year marked the 20th year of Chapter support for VSK, with 65 members turning out on 51 Harley-Davidson motorcycles and several others in classic cars. It also marked the retirement of "Rab" Smith who has lead the VSK ride since 2001– a huge effort from a man-mountain.

Everyone gets to check out the assembled vehicles, talk to the owners, ask questions and get their photo taken on, or in, their favourites before the thank you rides are organised. Some of the smaller kids or those with severe physical disabilities are still catered for by riding in sidecars or the classic cars.

This is followed by an open forum where kids, parents and VSK staff get the opportunity to share heart-felt stories of what the camp has meant to them. It turns out that the biker dress-code of dark glasses can also hide a few leaked emotions.

At the end of the day the DanHOG Director, Rod Gadsden, presented a \$2,000 donation to the VSK Camp Leader – Matt Devine.

To witness the excited laughs, smiles, joy and appreciation of these very special kids is heart-warming for all involved Long may it continue.
